Pastor's Paragraphs . . .

She wasn't a preacher. Yet some of you may know her name and remember her. Erma Bombeck. She was an author, speaker and humorist. Noted for her political and cultural observations that mixed humor with everyday life, one of her earlier articles included the following New Year's resolutions:

- 1. I'm going to clean this place when the kids grow up.
- 2. I will go to no doctor whose office plants have died.
- 3. I'm going to follow my husband's advise to put a little excitement into our life and live within our budget.
- 4. I'll apply for a hardship scholarship to Weight Watchers.
- 5. I will never loan my car to anyone I have birthed.
- 6. And, like last year, I will remember that my children need love the most when they deserve it the least.

You can certainly see and appreciate her sense of humor in those words, can't you? Erma, who had been born in 1927, had been diagnosed with an incurable kidney disease when she was only 20 years old. Even though she later fought breast cancer and other health issues, it was the kidney disease that she lived with every day of every week.

That may be why she chose to see the humor in life. That may be why she chose to have a positive attitude and look for the good in people and events around her. Certainly it had a profound impact on her and, I have to confess, I used to love reading her articles and she had a profound impact on my life.

In the 1980's, her disease progressed to be almost unbearable and she became a candidate for a kidney transplant. In response to other people's concern, she revised an earlier article and wrote the following article to encourage people. Take a few moment to read and reflect on each of her observations.

Things I Would do differently If I Had My Life to Live Over:

- 1. I would have invited friends over to dinner even if the carpet was stained and the sofa faded.
- 2. I would have eaten the popcorn in the "GOOD" living room and worried much less about the dirt when someone wanted to light a fire in the fireplace.
- 3. I would have taken the time to listen to my grandfather ramble about his youth.
- 4. I would never have insisted the car windows be rolled up on a summer day because my hair had just been teased and sprayed.
- 5. I would have sat on the lawn with my children and not worried about grass stains.
- 6. I would never have bought anything just because it was practical, wouldn't show soil or was guaranteed to last a lifetime.
- 7. When my kids kissed me impetuously, I would never have said, "Later. Now go get washed up for dinner."
- 8. There would have been more "I love you's" and more "I'm sorry's" but mostly, given another shot at life, I would seize every minute....look at it and really see it ... live it! And never give it back.
- 9. I would have gone to bed when I was sick instead of pretending the earth would go into a holding pattern if I wasn't there for the day.
- 10. I would have cried and laughed less while watching television . . . and more while watching life.

As we begin 2017 together, let me make a gentle suggestion. Take a few minutes to reflect on what you would do differently if you had your life to live over and then live in 2017 with those same priorities. We cannot change the past but we CAN choose to live now in such a way that we won't wish we had lived differently!!

Dear Church Family,


Thank you for the prayers, beautiful cards, love and words of encouragement before and during Larry's move to Eastern Kentucky Veterans Center.
